









The Town has been actively working with Greenlight since January 2020 on several network expansion projects in Perinton.

Since January 2020, 14 total Right of Way (ROW) permits have been issued, permitting 37,000+ Linear Feet of conduit and 4,000+ Linear Feet of overhead cable in Perinton.

The Town's thorough permit review approach and construction monitoring of utility projects in the ROW has always been with the residents and existing facilities best interests in mind.

We recognize the importance and benefit of having an alternative broadband service provider for our residents and we continue to work with Greenlight on their expansion plans.



Building permits - the most since 2005. Issued permits for 21 new single-family homes in 2021.



PARKER PLACE

Located on Route 250, Parker Place is a Pride Mark Homes mixed multi-family community totaling 120 units in 11 buildings with 9 acres of preservation lands/open space. This includes several multi-family buildings, townhomes, and a community clubhouse/pool.

This project was first proposed in 2019 and subsequently appeared before the Planning Board, Conservation Board, and Town Board. This type of community housing is indemand in Perinton, especially with our active senior population; however, Parker Place is not limited to 55+.





JANDERS RUN

Axel Rim Trail.

A Tomax Homes project near the RS&E Trail with 17 total lots for single-family homes, 14 have been completed.



The average sale price is \$37,000 higher than this time

last year. The current inventory is lower than in 2021.

WHITNEY EAST

Whitney Road.

An Aristo project, this is a small pocket of nine unique, custom-designed homes with a large front porch and rear garage.





HOMESTEAD ON KREAG

412 Kreag Road.

A Riedman Homes project, this is a six-lot single-family residential subdivision located between Bittersweet Road and Little Spring Run. Four homes are complete.





TENDRIL LANDING

An ANCO Builders project located off of Emerald Hill, near Garnsey Road and 250. There are nine lots in total; site work is in progress.





DWELL

Jefferson Ave.

An Aristo project, two new buildings – an estate home and barn - will be built, containing 11 units between the two structures.





PERINTON SQUARE MALL

Façade renovation, parking lot, and pedestrian circulation improvements.

Recently welcomed Chipotle and Starbucks to Perinton Square - and LA Fitness plans to open this Summer.



Opening this summer, LA Fitness will be located in the Tops building.






WEGMANS PLAZA FACADE
